The central character, a clown who is a Jesus figure, changes the lives and attitudes of those around him by his deeds.

This classic movie starring Martin Sheen has been transferred from movie to VHS to DVD. In the capital of San Ords, Latin America, Bobo the Clown and his friends have been charged with political subversion. Bobo pokes fun at the arresters, calls the junta a circus and turns the prison into a stage for his antics. Ultimately he is given a charge by the junto or be shot. A promotional DVD for the National Youth Event of the United Church of Christ. May be updated.

DVA-510 VOLUNTEER MINISTRIES: WITH THE HEART AND MIND OF A SERVANT- (A); 13 min.; Guide; United Church of Christ, 2005.

This DVD is the story of United Church of Christ Volunteer Ministries during the past fifty years and into the future. Volunteers who have heeded God’s call to serve others have found their own lives changed in the process. The DVD is useful as a recruiting tool.

This DVD celebrates the rich history of the United Church of Christ and looks to its future.

This documentary, narrated by President Hazel O’Leary of Fisk University, features students, faculty, colleges, seminaries and academies. It moves quickly, incorporates music with a beat to pull in the young and substance to educate viewers who are interested in United Church of Christ schools.

DVA-513 SACRED COVENANTS, FAITHFUL CONVER-SATIONS- (A); 1 DVD; 45 min.; No guide; United Church of Christ, 2006.

This DVD is a resource for talking about marriage equality, which includes the UCC General Synod 25 floor debate on the resolution, “In support of Marriage Equality.” It is an excellent companion to the study resource, “God is Still Speaking about Marriage.”

DVB-506 DISCOVERING THE BIBLE hosted by Russell

Boulter- (Y/A); 1 DVD, 4 sessions, 30 min. ea.; Guide, student handouts and worksheets; Christian History Institute, 1996.

This 4-part series on 2 videos is a basic introduction to the Bible. It includes a discussion of where the Bible came from and how it was handed down to us.

- .1 Part 1 **GETTING ACQUAINTED** is an overview of the history, content, and application of the Bible for today.
Part 2 **THE OLD TESTAMENT** talks about the Biblical archaeology of the Old Testament including the discovery of the Dead Sea Scrolls.
- .2 Part 3 **THE NEW TESTAMENT** focuses on Jesus and the authenticity of His words. It explains how the New Testament books were gathered and selected.
Part 4 **SURVIVAL, SPREAD, AND INFLUENCE** shows the Bible's influence in the development of western civilization and culture. The program shows how the Bible survived through repeated persecution and describes how Bible translation accompanied the spread of Christianity. It gives examples of ways the Bible has transformed individual lives.

DVB-517 WALKING THE BIBLE: A JOURNEY BY LAND THROUGH THE FIVE BOOKS OF MOSES with Bruce Feiler- (A);

DVD; 168 min. No guide; accompanying book-ABB-5; WGBH, Boston Video, 2005, Gift.

Both a heart-racing adventure and an uplifting quest, the DVD presents one man's epic journey-by foot, jeep, rowboat, and camel-through the greatest stories ever told. The stories of the Torah come alive as Bruce Feiler searches across three continents for the stories and heroes shared by Christians and Jews. This inspiring odyssey will forever change your view of history's most legendary events.

DVB-519 LOST WORLDS: JESUS' JERUSALEM- (SH/A); 50 min.; No guide; A & E History Channel, 2006.

This fascinating archaeological history of the city of Jerusalem up to and during the time of Jesus captivates the viewer. Much of the DVD tells the amazing story of the building of Herod's temples with archaeologists' comments interspersed with pictures of Jesus in various locations.

DVC-548THE CONGREGATION: QUESTIONS OF FAITH IN CHANGING TIMES- (A); DVD; 120 min.; UCom, 2004.

The DVD chronicles the life of a liberal Methodist Church as it struggles with pastoral change. One pastor's problem involves the worship style; the other pastor, a homosexual, brings up the question of gays as clergy.

DVC-549 CHRISTIAN FUNDAMENTALS IN A TIME OF CHANGE AND CONFLICT with Marcus Borg- (A); 1 hr. 25 min. No guide; Westar, 2004.

Marcus Borg gives his view of what is happening in the modern church. He speaks of an early paradigm, an emerging paradigm, and Christian fundamentals for our time. Borg defines the relational and transformational meaning of faith. There is a time of questions and answers after his talk.

DVC-550 HYMNS OF PRAISE: THE STORY OF HYMNWRITER CHARLES WESLEY- (Y/A); 90 min.; No guide; EcuFilm, 2006.

In this fascinating one-man play, John Jackman portrays Charles Wesley, who wrote more than 6,500 hymns. The play tells the stories of the early days of Methodism, Charles's conversion, and unfolding events as Charles and his brother John begin to preach and sing in England.

DVC-551 BILLY GRAHAM: A PERSONAL CRUSADE (Biography series)- (Y/A); 50 min.; Guide; History Channel, 2005.

Billy Graham converts masses. He is thought by many to be the voice of God, yet he walks among us today. The most famous and followed evangelist ever, Billy Graham preaches and millions listen.

DVC-552 JOHN CALVIN – HIS LIFE AND LEGACY- (A); 1 hr.; Printable Guide; Witherspoon Press, 2009.

World-renowned scholars and Reformed church leaders tell the story of the 16th century pastor John Calvin. Using stunning photography and clear, insightful scholarship and analysis, this project dispels the myths of, and sets the context and conditions for, Calvin's effect on the church and the whole course of Western civilization.

DVC-553 DR. DAVID LIVINGSTONE: MISSIONARY EXPLORER TO AFRICA- (Y/A); 56 min.; No guide; Vision Video/Gateway, 2011.

Dr. David Livingstone took the Gospel to Africa in word and deed. As a medical doctor, he treated the sick, earning him the necessary trust and respect to teach the love of Christ which many Africans freely embraced. Livingstone's commitment and eventual martyrdom helped bring an end to the slave trade and opened a continent to the Gospel.

DVC-554 JOHN NEWTON: A RUTHLESS SLAVE TRADER BECOMES A MESSENGER OF AMAZING GRACE- (Y/A); 45 min.; No Guide; Vision Video/Gateway, 2010.

As a person who had grown up in the church under the tutelage of a very godly mother and who later became a faithless rebel, Newton may have felt he was "the worst." His story teaches us never to give up on anyone. As Newton's famous hymn says, "Amazing Grace, how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me." This documentary explores Newton's life from his turbulent youth to his involvement in the 18th century slave trade, his dramatic conversion aboard a sinking ship and on through his remarkable ministry as an evangelistic preacher, hymn writer and abolitionist.

DVC-555 PATRICK: HE IGNITED A FLAME OF FAITH IN IRELAND- (Y/A); 45 min.; No guide; Vision/Gateway, 2011.

This DVD explores the life of Saint Patrick, a real man who most likely lived in the 5th century. As a sixteen-year-old boy he was captured and sold as a slave in Ireland. In the loneliness of his captivity, he encountered the freedom of God's grace. After escaping enslavement he returned home, but heard God's call to return to Ireland and bring the Gospel to his former captors. This docu-drama features enlightening interviews with noted scholars and captivating reenactments of Patrick's life.

DVC-556 SERVANT OF CHRIST: ROBERT JERMAIN THOMAS AND THE KOREAN REVIVALS- (Y/A); 27 min.; No guide; Vision Video/Gateway, 2011.

In 1866 Welsh missionary to China, Robert Jermain Thomas, sailed up the Taedong River near Pyongyang dressed in traditional Korean garb and carrying Bibles. The ship Thomas sailed upon, an American vessel, was attacked and the crew was killed. When Thomas came ashore, he carried a white flag and a number of Bibles. A Korean combatant approached him, and Thomas reached out to hand the man a Bible just before the soldier brought a sword down upon his neck. Twenty-four years later, Samuel Moffett, the first full-time missionary to Korea, met many of the people who had had contact with Thomas, including the children of his executioner. Several of these Koreans became leaders in the budding Christian movement. This enthralling documentary traces the historical roots of Christianity on the Korean Peninsula.

DVC-557 BILLY: THE EARLY YEARS OF BILLY GRAHAM- (SH/A); 1 DVD; 98 min.; No guide; Vision Video, 2010.

Discover Billy as the earnest and promising young man at the crossroads of faith and doubt, ultimately facing the moment of decision that gives way to history's most influential evangelist. Cast includes Martin Landau, Lindsay Wagner and country music sensation Josh Turner.

DVC-558 BONHOEFFER: AGENT OF GRACE- (A) 1 DVD; 90 min.; Aid Association for Lutherans, 2000.

This DVD brings to life the heroic rebellion of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a highly regarded Lutheran pastor who confronted the horrors of Nazi Germany during WWII. This award-winning production is the compelling story of the moral conflict Bonhoeffer faced as he struggled between his conscience and his loyalty to the state.

DVC-559 WESLEY: A Heart Transformed Can Change the World- (SH/A); 1 DVD; 117 min.; No guide; Vision Video, 2014.

Step into eighteenth-century England and experience the transformation of one man, whose heart-wrenching search for peace haunts even as he points himself into a life of service and evangelism. Learn about his controversial "Method." Marked by confrontation, tension, and mob violence, a house fire, near shipwreck on the high seas, adventure in a new world, and ill-fated romance, Wesley's perseverance compelled him to a new type of itinerant, open-air ministry to the lowest classes of society. An inspiring story.

DVD-516 CONFUCIUS: WORDS OF WISDOM- (A); 50 min.; No guide; A & E Biography, 1996.

This DVD explores the life and legacy of the ancient sage whose timeless message remains deeply influential to this day. Confucius's name is synonymous with ageless wisdom. **Biography** journeys back into China's troubled feudal era to uncover his dramatic story from his childhood poverty and long road to enlightenment to his years as a celebrated teacher. Leading scholars reveal why his message of "five virtues" was not always accepted by the period's leaders and interviews with a direct descendant provide a personal glimpse into Confucius's legend.

DVD-517 INSIDE ISLAM- (A); 100 min.; No guide; History Channel, 2002.

This DVD lifts the veil of mystery surrounding a misunderstood faith. Trace its roots back to the Hebrew Bible and discover how the Five Pillars, the religion's central tenets, helped spread Islam to the far corners of the world. Find out what the Qur'an says about war and violence, and how these words have been co-opted by extremists. Hear from experts like Khaled Abou el Fadl (Speaking in God's Name), who debate the challenges facing Islam today, including a crisis of authority and deep divisions among many sects.

DVD-518 DECODING THE PAST SECRETS OF THE KORAN- (A); 91 min.; No guide; History Channel, 2006.

This DVD probes the heart of the book that many outside Islam find mysterious. This feature-length program examines the history of the verses as well as the striking similarities and differences between the Koran and the Bible. Trace the influences of the Koran from the Golden Age of Islam to modern times and explore the interpretation and development of various themes such as Judgment Day and jihad. Top experts and scholars of Islam share their insights into the book that lies at the foundation of one of the world's great religions.

DVD-519 SOME TIPS FROM THE FIRST AXIAL AGE with Karen Armstrong (A);-Westar

Karen Armstrong, former nun, discusses the changes need to be made in spiritual development since the first Axial Age. Armstrong discusses the development in the early days called The First Axial Age of most of the major religions. She stressed the need to learn from the First Axial Age for new emphases in modern times where much fear and violence exist on a spirituality of integrity and peace.

- DVE-503 THE FOURTH WISEMAN-** (Y/A); 72 min.; no guide; Vision Video, 1985.
Based on Henry Van Dyke's classic, the video is a fictional story set in Biblical times. It tells the story of a fourth Magi, Artaban, who goes on a journey to take three precious gifts to the Messiah. On the way, Artaban uses his gifts to help people in dire need. He finally encounters Jesus on Easter Sunday.
- DVE-505 THE LAST SUPPER AND BIBLICAL CUISINE-** (Y/A); 60 min.; No Guide; Cookbook; MIRKHAM Productions, 1993.
Filmed and dramatized entirely on location in the Holy Land and the Middle East, **THE LAST SUPPER** restores this special event emphasizing both the Christian tradition and its Jewish roots. It explores the recipes of the exotic Biblical courses served at the supper and includes a Seder cookbook.
- DVE-511 PROPHECIES OF THE PASSION-** (SH/A); DVD; 60 min.; No guide; EcuFilm, 2005.
The DVD explores the Gospel accounts of Christ's death from the fascinating perspective of the prophecies that show that Jesus was not an unfortunate victim of circumstances, but his life and death happened in the manner that was precisely ordained by God. This unforgettable documentary is a unique source of insights, encouragement, and confirmation of faith.
- DVE-513 ROAD TO EMMAUS: THE GREATEST MYSTERY REVEALED-** (Y/A); 30 min.; No guide; Vision Video, 2009. (Also in Spanish)
Mourning the death of Jesus, two first-century travelers on the road to Emmaus were joined by a mysterious stranger. Over the next few hours, the stranger revealed mysteries in the ancient Scriptures. Eventually the travelers recognized Jesus

-F- (Family)

- DVF-527 SHATTERED DREAMS – HEALING AFTER DIVORCE-** (A); DVD; 30 min.; Guide; Paraclete Press, 2004.
This DVD features men and women who have suffered the pain of divorce, have walked through the recovery process, and have found healing and hope in life again. It offers insightful help on: rejection, grief, anger, intimacy, forgiveness, and letting go.

-G- (God, Death, Grief, Suffering)

DVG-511 GOD, WHY? TEACHINGS FROM THE TSUNAMIS- (A); 1 DVD, 1CD; 2 sessions; 30 min.; EcuFilm, 2005.

This two-session small group study on DVD and CD provides resources to help Christians better understand God's activity in the midst of natural disasters.

DVG-512 NOOMA series with Rob Bell- (Y/A); 24 DVDs; 10-14 min. ea.; Guides; French, German, Korean, Mandarin, Portuguese, and Spanish subtitles; Gospel Direct, 2002-2006 and EcuFilm, 2007+.

This set of short films features communicators that really speak to us. Every DVD touches on issues that we care about and want to teach about that are presented in a way that fits into our world. Each one emphasizes some aspect of each person's relationship with God.

- .1 **RAIN** deals with the issue of "Where is God when we are suffering?" Rob Bell suggests that God is closer to us than we think and that our times of pain give God an opportunity to remind us of how much God loves us. 11 min.
- .2 **FLAME-** God created love and wants us to feel it, all in the way it's meant to be felt. 11 min.
- .3 **TREES-** Rob Bell discusses ways in which religion is relevant to our lives. God wants our lives to have meaning today and forever. Rob shows how all the choices we make now will shape our world and lives for eternity. 13 min.
- .4 **SUNDAY-** This DVD shows how God doesn't want meaningless rituals, but wants our hearts. 12 min.
- .5 **NOISE-** suggest that there may be a connection between the amount of noise in our lives and our inability to hear God. If God sometimes feels distant to us, maybe we're not really listening for God to talk to us. 10 min.
- .6 **KICKBALL-** Sometimes we ask God for things and if He doesn't deliver right away, we start questioning whether God really understands or even cares. We must trust that God is good and sees a bigger picture than we ever could. 11 min.
- .7 **LUGGAGE-** God created us to be free from carrying around hurts and resentments by forgiving those who have injured us. 13 min.
- .8 **DUST-** Believing in God is important, but it is also important that we live so that God believes in us. If we have more insight into the culture that Jesus grew up in and some of the radical things He did, maybe we can understand the faith that God has in all of us. 14 min.
- .9 **BULLHORN-** Maybe the best way to show our love for God is actually by loving other people no matter how hard it sometimes is. Jesus doesn't separate loving God and loving others. 12 min.
- .10 **LUMP-** All of us carry around with us some personal "junk." No matter how big our junk is, no matter how much what we've done has impacted the way other people feel about us or how we feel about ourselves, it hasn't changed how God feels about us. God loves us. He always has and He always will. 12 min.

- .11 **RHYTHM-** What does it mean to have a relationship with God? Jesus said He came to give life in its fullest to everyone. Rob Bell suggest that it's through trusting Jesus and living the life He taught us to live, that we can have a relationship with God. 12 min.
- .12 **MATTHEW-** Suffering the loss of someone we love can be the most difficult thing in life we face. All kinds of expressions of grief are acceptable to God. Sometimes all the reasoning and comforting words in the world just aren't what we need. What might help us, however, is to understand how Jesus dealt with this kind of loss. 14 min.
- .13 **RICH-** There's a popular bumper sticker that reads, "God Bless America," but hasn't America already been blessed? It's easy for us to fall into the mindset of "our" world as "the" world. How does what we have compare to what most people in the world have? Maybe God has blessed us so we can bless and give to others. 12 min.
- .14 **BREATHE-** For thousands of years, people have understood that our physical breath is a picture of a deeper spiritual reality. The inherent dilemma at the core of what makes us human is that God has created us and that we possess great power and strength, and yet our lives are incredibly vulnerable and fragile. Perhaps if we had more insight into the meaning of breathing, we would better understand how God created us as human beings. 14 min.
- .15 **YOU-** Many people often debate the central claims of the Christian Faith, but maybe a better understanding of the history of the early Christian movement would give new perspective to these discussions. Perhaps some of the claims of the Christian faith that we typically perceive to be unique aren't really that special. Maybe we don't put enough emphasis on the things that really matter in our lives. 13 min.
- .16 **STORE-** We all get angry from time to time. What is really the root of our anger? Maybe, if we learn where our anger comes from, we can channel it toward something constructive—something bigger than ourselves. 14 min.
- .17 **TODAY-** How much time and energy do we spend wishing things were how they used to be? Some of us believe our best days may actually be behind us. If we're hung up on the past, what does that mean for our lives now? Maybe we need to learn to embrace our past for what it is in order to live our lives to the fullest right here, right now. 11 min.
- .18 **NAME-** Why are we so concerned with what other people think, say, or look like? What does it say about us if we are unable to accept who we are? Maybe if we really knew our true selves, we wouldn't give so much attention to other people's lives and live more in tune with the life God wants for us. 11 min.
- .19 **OPEN-** Does God answer prayer? Sometimes, but not all the time—or does God always answer prayer and it's just that sometimes God says, "No!" 12 min.
- .20 **SHELLS-** We're doing so many things, a little bit of everything, and yet it doesn't feel like much of a life. Most of us find it hard to say, "No." There are so many good things to do, but while we're busy doing all these good things, we may be missing out on something great! Maybe saying, "No," would be easier if we knew what it meant to say, "Yes."
- .21 **SHE-** We didn't have anything to do with our birth. We are here because some woman somewhere gave us life. Her pain, her effort, for our life. When a mother gives like that to a child, she is showing us what God is like. A lot of us are comfortable with male imagery for God, but what about female imagery for God. Is God limited to a gender? Or does God transcend and yet include what we know as male and female? Maybe if we were more aware of the feminine imagery for God, we would have a better understanding of who God is and what God is like.
13 min.
- .22 **TOMATO-** We can all get consumed with ourselves. We feel that our worth and value come from how good, how smart, and how skilled we are. Jesus invites us to let these false ideas die, that our worth comes from the things we say and do. Maybe it's only when we let these things die, that we truly begin to live. 13 min.
- .23 **CORNER-** Why is it that often when we get what we want, we still feel empty? We work so hard to succeed, but our lives just end up becoming more about us. Can success turn on us? Can we get caught up in a smaller world where our lives are all about the things that we want? Or is there another way to live where we see people in need and we do something about it. And maybe in attempting to save someone else from suffering, we find out that we are actually the ones being saved.
- .24 **WHIRLWIND-** There aren't nice, neat answers for why certain things happen to certain people. Often the perspective of a friend can help, but when there is nothing more to say, where do we turn? Maybe that's when God finally speaks.

DVG-515 GROW OLD ALONG WITH ME: THE POETRY OF AGING (A); 57 min.; No guide; National Film Network, 2000.

Artists Frederick and Claske Franck, opera singer Shirley Verrett, ninety-year-old photographer Leni Sonnenfeld, and Buddhist nun Pema Chodron see aging as a creative process that carries with it an opportunity for giving birth in later years to one's full humanity. With spirit and insight, they show us how to adapt to the changes taking place in our bodies, in our relationships, and in the circumstances of our lives.

DVG-516 A HISTORY OF GOD- (A); 100 min. No guide; The History Channel, 2001.

A History of God investigates humankind's timeless and unrelenting struggle for faith, comfort, and understanding. In this illuminating program based on theologian Karen Armstrong's bestselling book, take a fascinating look at the countless ways human beings have experienced the idea of God throughout the ages: from the days of before Abraham to today. Explore the evolution from the practice of sacrificial paganism to a more serene and compassionate religious way of life. Interviews with representatives from today's key monotheistic religions reveal how human beings have come to worship one supreme being, while prominent religious scholars contemplate how the traditions of Judaism, Christianity, and Islam have influenced one another and how their individual histories overlap.

DVG-517 THE CASE FOR A CREATOR with Lee Strobel- (Y/A); 60 min. plus 40 min. of bonus material; No guide; Illustra Media, 2006. Based on a **New York Times** best-seller, this DVD is a remarkable film about Lee Strobel's journey from spiritual skepticism to a profound faith in the God who has etched His indelible signature upon every galaxy and living cell. The Creator is now revealed by 21st century science.

DVG-518 DIGITAL DIARY- (Y/A); 3 DVDs, 1 session ea.; 10-12 min. each DVD; Guide; God Films, 2009/10. Each short video features an individual on a mysterious and introspective journey to understand where God is in his or her life. Each journey features a digital diary that causes individuals to reexamine their faith.

- .1 **LAURA-** Laura looks at the question, "Where is God on your priority list?" She must look inside herself, amidst her complicated and busy life, to discover what it means to let go. (10 min.)
- .2 **ROBBY-**Robby deals with the fact that what is happening in the world around us is not always what's happening on the inside with our relationship to God. Sometimes, when we're feeling trapped, we have the best chance of catching glimpses of God in our lives. Robby learns to accept his family and gain strength from his relationship with God. (12 min.)
- .3 **CHRISTINE-** Christine deals with the question of whether we can trust God to heal our broken relationships. Are we imprisoned by past choices? Christine is the story of a young woman struggling to understand her past while trying to save her marriage. This film will spark the audience to explore the difficult subjects of trust, forgiveness, and grace. (12 min.)

DVH-509 THE CHANGING FACE OF THE AFRICAN AMERICAN CHURCH: MINISTRY TO YOUNG ADULTS- (A); 25 min.; Guide; Presbyterian Church (USA), 2004.

Many churches find it difficult to reach out to young African American adults. This DVD helps congregations to talk about some of the issues facing the church as it tries to open its doors to young adults.
