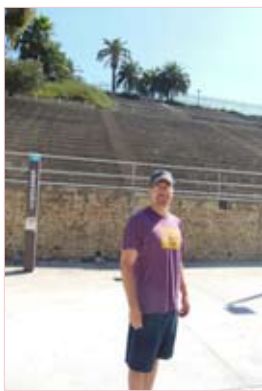

THE PLACE WHERE HE SPOKE

In June of 1963, Pres. John F. Kennedy delivered the commencement address at San Diego State University. Today, we can watch Kennedy's speech, along with the motorcade that delivered him to the SDSU campus, on YouTube. In my opinion, this was not one of his best or most memorable speeches.



On that day, he spoke about the importance of education in the state of California, the ideals of a free society, and the necessity of giving every child opportunities to develop his or her talents.

All right, Kennedy also made the following comment: "To govern is to choose and the ability to make those choices wise and responsible and prudent requires the best of us all."

The Rev. Dr. Robin R. Meyers will be Stone Church's *Henrietta Perdue Lecturer*, on Friday evening, Nov. 15, and Saturday morning, Nov. 16.



He will also preach on Sunday, Nov. 17.

A nationally known progressive UCC pastor, professor, and peace activist, Dr. Meyers is also the author of six books about Christianity and American society, including:

📖 *Saving Jesus from the Church: How to Stop Worshiping Christ and Start Following Jesus*

📖 *Why the Christian Right is Wrong: a Minister's Manifesto for Taking Back Your Faith, Your Flag, Your Future*

📖 *The Virtue in the Vice: Finding Seven Lively Virtues in the Seven Deadly Sins*

Dr. Meyers has been the senior minister of Mayflower Congregational UCC church, Oklahoma City, for 27 years, and is a tenured full professor of rhetoric in the philosophy department at Oklahoma City University.

In April, Dr. Meyers was a featured speaker at the *Westar Convention* (formerly known as *The Jesus Seminar*). Just before coming to Stone, he will have presented, at Yale Divinity School, the prestigious Lyman Beecher Lectureship on Preaching, given each year since 1871.

Costs for the lectures are \$20 for Friday, \$20 for both Saturday lectures, or \$30 for all three. Student prices are \$10 for Friday or Saturday, or \$20 for all three. Tickets can be purchased in the Church Office or at the door on Friday or Saturday.

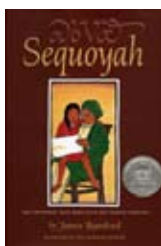

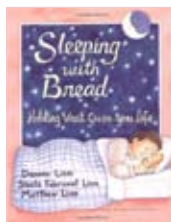

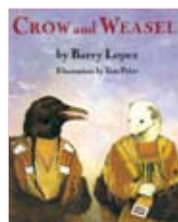

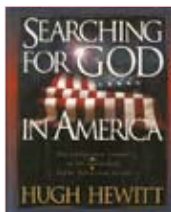

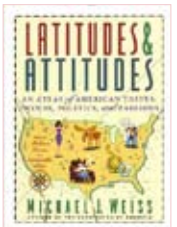

That's worth remembering. And yet while this comment stands apart, what is of more interest to us is that President Kennedy's life would be taken from him five months later.

November 22, 2013, marks the 50th anniversary of that terrible day when we lost one of the most popular presidents in U.S. history.

When Heather and I visited our daughter down at San Diego State for parents' weekend, I was surprised to learn that while SDSU has developed into a state of the art college campus, the concrete bleachers on which students and faculty once sat listening to Kennedy have been set aside in remembrance of the event. Indeed, adjacent to the Aztec basketball arena sits a salient piece of American history - the old with the new, the past with the future, hope mixed with grief. Standing there, I imagined how exciting it must be for parents, students, and professors to hear such an eloquent speaker and icon.

As we move closer to the national holiday of Thanksgiving, my prayer is that we would give thanks for leaders in our churches, nation, and community: for their courage in times of doubt, for their willingness to serve the needs of others, for voting their conscience rather than from popularity or party affiliation, and for their ability to make wise choices ... for as John F. Kennedy once said, "... the ability to choose ... requires the best of us all ..."

My birthday was at the end of May, and I entered into what I'm calling my *Jesus year*. For those of you who may be curious, the *Jesus year* is usually the 33rd year of a person's life; it was known to be Jesus' final year before his death. This sounds morbid, I know, but many have used their *Jesus year* as an impetus for being more courageous, taking risks, or doing something with their lives that they've always wanted to do.

One practice I decided to take on during my *Jesus year* is the practice of giving thanks. A friend of mine gave me a journal, and I decided that at the end of each day during my *Jesus year*, I would write down or draw three things for which I was thankful. Five months later, I am happy to report that I am still doing this practice faithfully, and it has been a great experience so far.

You see, some days, writing or sketching down three things

is very easy. On those days, limiting the list to only three things is the hardest part! On other days, I am really digging to come up with three things to list. But this ritual and practice has been incredibly good for me. On the good days, it reminds me how life is so good, and on the hard days, it reminds me that goodness still resides in my life.

In this month of Thanksgiving, I encourage you to try this practice. Don't be limited to words only. Drawing or taking photos of those things you are thankful for is also a great way to be aware of what's around you.

And if you have a photo or an image that you take of gratitude, send it to me. Ken and I would love to incorporate your images into a Worship service on Nov. 24. Let us all practice giving thanks.

Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good. God's love endures forever. (Psalm 136:1)

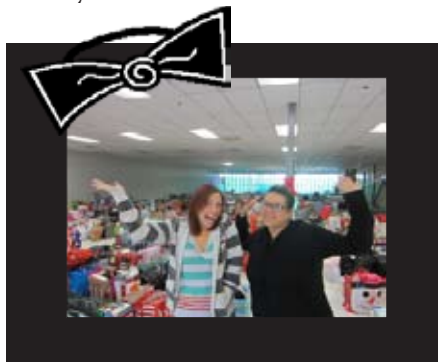

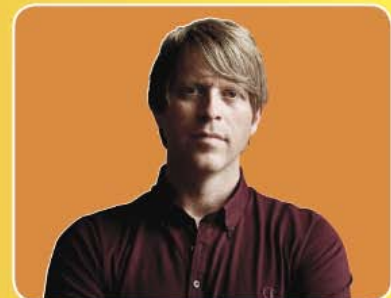
